The work we've done at the wastewater treatment plant, expanding the plant's capacity for future needs, was essential to this community. The current 1000 North road project will pro-

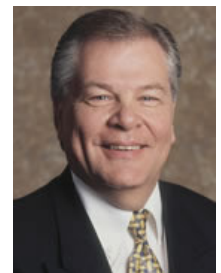

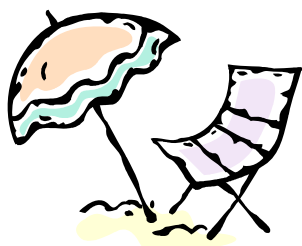
