## From the Mayor

In regards to the jury verdict in the Tooele Associates' lawsuit, it is very important that each of you know how disappointed we are with the jury decision. I have followed our case very closely during the 13 day trial and I believe the city's case was presented very well. The reasoning behind the defense was sound. There are many factors that play into a decision made by juries that may or may not influence their decision - - sometimes it has nothing to do with the evidence presented to them. Having said that, I respect the justice system and will do what's required. In most civil trials of this type there are normal procedural matters that are addressed; we are proceeding with those at this time. The message I want to send to each of you is, I will do whatever is necessary to protect your interest not only

financially but for each of you generally. I know the city council feels the same. We will pursue every legal remedy to mitigate this totally unjustified verdict. We are confident the verdict will not stand. This suit was filed in 2002. When I took office in 2006 I immediately made serious efforts to settle the city's differences with Tooele Associates. I tried on 3 separate occasions; unfortunately much time had gone by. As we proceed with the legal remedies available to us, more information on the real merits of the suit will come forward.

## Water Conservation Schedule

**Area #1** All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

**Area #2** All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

**Area #3** All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

### Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, between 10 am and 6 pm. If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses-such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at 843-2150. City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas.

## EVER THOUGHT OF RUNNING FOR OFFICE? Here's How:

This fall, Tooele City will hold an election to elect a Mayor for a four-year term, and two council members for four-year terms. To qualify, you must be: (1) a United States citizen; (2) at least 18 years old; (3) a resident of Tooele City for at least one year immediately preceding the date of the election; and (4) a registered

voter.

If there are a sufficient number of candidates, Tooele City will hold a primary election on September 15th. The general election will be November 3, 2009.

If you are interested in running for either Mayor or city council, visit the Tooele City Recorder's Office at 90 N.

Main St. You will need to file a Declaration of Candidacy and pay a filing fee of \$50 for Mayor and \$30 for Council.

The filing period runs from July 1, 2009 to July 15, 2009 during regular business hours (Monday- Friday, 8 am to 5 pm).

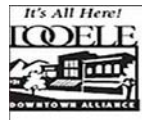

## So, you want to keep chickens . . .

If you want to keep chickens, please keep the following restrictions in mind if you live in a residential zone within Tooele City:

1. You will need a fully or partially enclosed coop with a roof for your chickens.
2. All such structures shall be at least 50 feet from dwellings on adjacent lots, at least 30 feet from adjacent property lines, and at least 100 feet from any street.
3. You are limited to six chickens.
4. Roosters are generally considered to be a nuisance animal as they tend to create a lot of noise. If neighbors complain, and can document an on-going noise problem caused by your rooster(s), potential penalties may range from the loss of the animal all the way up to \$1,000 fine.
