Please locate your scheduled watering days on the schedule shown to the right and *water only on the days allowed for your area.* The watering schedule also applies to all businesses, schools and government agencies that use culinary water. No one should water between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.- - and no watering on Sundays.

Following this schedule will allow you to maintain your landscaping and keep your yards beautiful. Thank you for doing your part to conserve this most precious resource.

Have You Ever Thought About Running For City Council? Here's How:

This Fall, Tooele City will hold an election to elect 3 council members for a four-year term. To qualify as a candidate, you must be: (1) a United States citizen; (2) at least 18 years old; (3) a resident of Tooele City for at least one year immediately

preceding the date of the election; (4) a registered voter; and (5) not be a convicted felon.

If there are a sufficient number of candidates, Tooele City will hold a primary election on September 11, 2007. The general election is on Novem-

ber 6, 2007.

If you qualify and are interested in running for City Council, visit the Tooele City Recorder's Office at 90 N. Main St. You will need to file a *Declaration of Candidacy* form and pay a filing fee of \$30.00.

The filing period runs from July 2 to July 16th during regular business hours (Monday through Friday, 8 am to 5 pm).

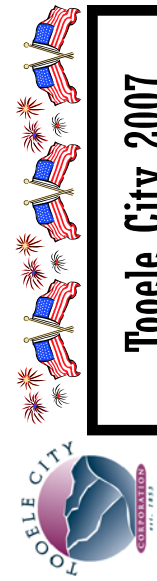

Parking on the 4th of July

Tooele Police would like to remind everyone there is no parking allowed on the July 4th parade route. Parking on the route creates hazardous conditions for the children by forcing them into the street dangerously close to the procession. Police will be out early checking the route and getting vehicles moved off the route as needed. Remember the parade route streets are: 200 South (east of Main), Main Street, Utah Avenue (west of Main) and 200 West (from Utah Ave to Vine). You can contact the city parks department for exact route details. Police would also like to remind parents to monitor their children closely during the parade to ensure they remain a safe distance away from the parade procession. This is most problematic when candy falls too close to the procession. As long as citizens are mindful of these rules and recommendations, we are confident the parade will be safe and fun for all.
