LOOK FOR NEW ID BADGES FOR TRANSIENT MERCHANTS

Tooele City now requires itinerant/transient merchants to wear an identification badge. What is an itinerant/transient merchant? It is someone that sells door-to-door or has a temporary stand or business.

These ID badges are a way for you, as a consumer, to know that the merchants are legal within Tooele City to do business. The ID badge will look like the badge depicted to the right and be a bright orange color that is easy to identify. If someone comes knocking on your door, wanting to sell you something, ask to see their itinerant/transient ID badge. If

they do not have one, you can call the City Recorder's Office, 843-2110, or the police department, 882-8900.

These badges also apply to vendors who set up temporary places of business on Main Street. While they are selling items, they must display their ID badge. The bright color of the badge will make it easier for policemen to identify legal vendors.

There are a few exceptions, if merchants obtained their business licenses before these badges were approved, they do not have to have an ID badge this year.

Kami Perkins, Tooele City's Human Resource Director, attended the event last year

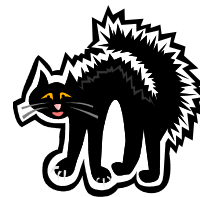


with her children. "I feel this is one of the best additions to our family Halloween traditions. The merchants were excellent with the kids and it was an

NOT REGISTERED TO VOTE? HERE'S HOW TO REGISTER

As a resident of Tooele City, it is important to let your voice be heard. Your opinions matter and registering to vote is easier than ever. Registration forms may be obtained at the County Clerk's Office, some local businesses, in the phone book, or visit www.co.tooele.ut.us/Forms and Applications/Voter Registration for an online form.

Voter registration forms must be post-

marked at least 20 days before an election. You may register in person at the County Clerk's Office, 47 S. Main, up until 8 days before the election.

You must be 18 years of age or older and be a U.S. citizen to register.

Voter registration is valid for life, unless you move, change your name, or wish to affiliate with a different party.

2. Decide whether your gift will be for a boy or girl from one of the following age groups: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14.



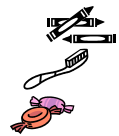
3. Fill the box with a variety of gifts using the list at the right as a guide. In a separate envelope you may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family.

4. **IMPORTANT:** Please enclose \$7.00 or more in an envelope and put it inside your box to help cover shipping costs. **MAKE CHECKS PAYABLE TO SAMARITAN'S PURSE.** Place the envelope on top of the gift so it is clearly visible. Then place a rubber band around your box and lid.

5. Drop off your shoe box gift to Tooele City Hall, 90 N. Main by November 3, 2006.

There will be information available about domestic violence, and/or dating violence and how to get help.


