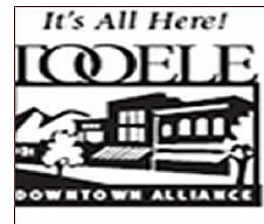

# Letter to Tooele County Registered Voters:

From the Tooele County Clerk's Office

The phenomenal growth in Tooele County the last few years has influenced our schools, our churches, as well as our polling locations. The number of voters per precinct combined with ADA requirements, available parking concerns and privacy while voting, has made it apparent that it is time to change some polling locations.

One of the good things that has happened with the growth is the addition of new buildings that address these problems, as well as being large enough to combine precincts and have more machines so the voting moves more quickly. Presidential Elections are known for having the biggest voter participation of any election. This year, I believe it will be even more so. With that in mind the following changes have been made:

Expanded **early voting** locations as well as extended hours: Three early voting locations will be open from 8:30 am to 8:00 pm and will run from October 21st through October 30th, Monday through Friday. On October 31st they will close at 5:00 pm. The locations are the Tooele County Building, Grantsville City Hall and Rose Springs Elementary in Stansbury Park. There will also be early voting at the Tooele Senior Citizens Center from 9:00 am to 12:00 noon on October 22nd and 4:30 to 6:00 on October 24th; and at the Grantsville Senior Citizens Center from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm on October 29th.

**By-Mail Voting:** is open to anyone who would like to vote by mail. You will have to fill out a By-Mail Voting Request form, which can be picked up in the clerk's office, or obtained on line at [www.co.tooele.ut.us/absentee.htm](http://www.co.tooele.ut.us/absentee.htm). You may vote by-mail for just

this election, or for all elections from now on. You are welcome to vote in our office beginning the middle of October, or we will be glad to mail the ballot to you.

Fill the box with a variety of gifts that will bring delight to a child.

#### TOYS

#### SCHOOL SUPPLIES
