From Mayor Dunlavy...

Summer has gone by too fast and soon we'll be enjoying another beautiful Tooele City winter. It seems the seasons, the months, and the years go by so quickly. Our children grow so fast—in my case, my beautiful grandchildren are getting so big in such a short time.

As I've looked back over this last year, special things have been accomplished: the end of the lawsuit with Grantsville City; funding for a new Applied Technology College is being finalized; Skyline Nature Park is underway; a negotiated settlement with Rocky Mountain Power, preserving

our Southeast Bench; and we acquired additional open space, keeping our beautiful mountain bench areas from development. This January, Phase II of the Wastewater Treatment Plant Project will be complete. We have also made \$992,150 of water infrastructure improvements, \$1,362,380 in road improvements, and \$71,733 in upgrades to the Pratt Aquatic Center—all completed this year.

Air Products Company is moving into the Conastoga Wood Products Building making a \$40,000,000 investment, creating new jobs with an average salary of \$50,000. We are currently in final negotiations with another company that will make another \$23,000,000 investment adding 279 new jobs when Phase II is completed. A lot has been accomplished in a very short time this year.

The year will be over soon and we will begin a new year, with new pro-

jects, with new challenges. We are prepared to meet them. We are all very fortunate to have the city council we have. It is really a privilege to work along side them.

A special thank you to Mr. Randy Sant. Without his expertise, experience, and political and business contacts, a lot of these projects would not have been possible. Mr. Sant has proven himself over and over again, long before I became Mayor.

Lastly, I would ask again that you vote on November 8. Study the candidates; determine for yourself if what they are saying is in the best interest of our city. The leadership on the council is vital to our future.

Tooele City Roadway Projects Update...

This year Tooele City has continued its efforts to maintain and preserve the life of the City's streets. The work completed this year has a total value of approximately \$1.4 million, and includes installation of accessible corner ramps, roto-mill and asphalt overlay, slurry seal and chip seal. With the exception of the chip seal project, all work has been substantially completed and will help extend the life and durability of our streets. In years past, the use of chip seal has proven to be a very cost effective means to extend the life of our streets; however, this year the application has not been effective and is not complete. The contractor has not been paid for this portion of the work, and will be required to return next spring when weather conditions are appropriate and complete the work. Thank you for your patience.
