

GRAVE DECORATIONS

Grave decorations are permitted 7 days before and 7 days after the following:

New Year's Day	Memorial Day	Halloween
Valentine's Day	Father's Day	Veteran's Day
St. Patrick's Day	4 th of July	Thanksgiving Day
Easter	24 th of July	Christmas
Mother's Day	Labor Day	Birthdays

Anniversary of/or the Death Date

During the winter months grave decorations will be allowed to remain on the graves between November 1 and March 1.

(If there is a burial in the immediate area, decorations will be removed from surrounding graves to prevent accidents. After the burial is completed, decorations will be returned to their appropriate graves.)

Flowers are permitted anytime in a vase that is built into the headstone, headstone base or the required 4" mowing strip.

Any miscellaneous decorations such as shepherd hooks, crosses, toys, pictures, trinkets or flowers are not allowed except on the holidays listed above.

Vases or miscellaneous decorations made of glass, porcelain or pottery will not be allowed in the Tooele City Cemetery.

Do not use wire, nails, hangers, steel rods, tent stakes, etc. to secure decorations to the ground.

Flowers that become worn or show weather damage will be discarded.

No planting or excavating is permitted in the Tooele City Cemetery.

The Cemetery will provide a temporary marker for a new burial where no existing headstone exists. The temporary marker will remain for six months or until a permanent headstone is placed, whichever occurs first.

Any error found in the Tooele City Cemetery Directories should be noted and reported to the Tooele City Cemetery Records Office.
