FROM THE MAYOR: PLEASE DO YOUR PART TO CONSERVE WATER

Water—it's so very im-
portant to our everyday
lives. It's also absolutely
essential to conserve it.
We've all heard it over and
over that we live in a desert-
it's true. We need to do our
part, each of us, to conserve
this precious resource.

With the growth that's
taken place in our city over
the past few years it's been
very difficult to keep pace.
We are aggressively dealing
with this important problem.
I want each of you to know,
we are addressing these wa-
ter concerns, but need your
help.

The council and I have
budgeted for two new wells
and are finishing the up-
grade of well number 9,
increasing its capacity. Our
parks and cemetery are all
on secondary water with the
exception of England Acres
and Parkers Park, so they do

not affect our culinary sys-
tem. Even though they are
not being watered with culi-
nary water, we are cutting
back their usage to help Set-
tlement Canyon and Middle
Canyon Irrigation Companies
conserve theirs. The city is
cutting back our watering
significantly and we have
asked the schools and
churches to do the same.

I'm asking each of you to
voluntarily cut back on your
outside watering. If you will
do this, coupled with the con-
struction of 2 new wells we
are putting in this summer, it
will help dramatically. It will
not totally solve the problem
but will allow us time to ade-
quately plan for the future.

The simple fact is, all of us
water way too much. I see
people water during the day
for very long periods, I also
see watering during rain
storms. We need to change

our hab-
its. Each
of us
must do
our part.
Stop
watering your outside areas
as often as you have, that
alone will help.

We have had well #12 go
down, it is one of the higher
producing wells. Until it's
repaired, there are going to be
periods of low pressure. If
we don't change our watering
habits there may even be
some areas that may be tem-
porarily without water. The
city is prepared to restrict
outside watering significantly
and to aggressively enforce
those restrictions. We are not
alone in this, every city in
Utah deals with these issues.
I'm asking for your help in
being part of the solution in
our city.
