## Mayor Dunlavy's State of the City Address

Chairman Pratt, members of the City Council, and citizens of this wonderful City, I have been reviewing the State of the City addresses for the eight previous years; time has gone by so quickly and yet we've accomplished so much! We've completed major road building projects, including 1000 North and Tooele Boulevard. We have completed a state-of-the-art Water and Wastewater Reclamation Facility. Significant road, water and wastewater infrastructure upgrades are completed. We have added new roads in our cemetery; built a beautiful, functional nature park on Skyline Drive; and added pavilions and upgrades to our park facilities. We have drilled 3 new water wells and added an additional 1 million gallon storage reservoir. We completely connected our entire water system, allowing us to now move water to any area of the City as needed. We have added hundreds of acres of new open space, preserving our East bench forever. We have acquired property for a new police

facility and a new fire station. We have a Library that has become a fun, exciting place to be, with programs and activities for everyone. We played a significantly vital role in the completion of the beautiful Tooele Applied Technology College, and the soon to be completed Utah State University technology building.

We have brought the arts back to Tooele City, thanks to the efforts of the Tooele City Arts Council and the City Council. We have transformed the yearly 4th of July celebration into a week of fun activities for everyone, ending with a great concert and super fireworks display. I am very proud of the many wonderful and exciting projects which have been completed!

I believe the state of our City is a city prepared for the future. Completion of our projects have positioned this wonderful City, not only to meet the needs of our citizens today, but well into the future. As always, there is more we have to do, and there will always be more to do. Keeping our City financially sound is of utmost importance. Providing quality public service to our citizens is why we're here. I and the City Council will continue to

work hard every day to make sure these two very important items are managed.

The exciting future of this wonderful City will bring new facilities for our exceptional police and fire departments as well as additions to our beautiful park and golf course facilities. New retail business will continue to come and be a part of our community. New manufacturing, industrial and distribution operations will create new jobs for our citizens. **Poison Prevention Week is March 16th-22nd!**

Each year, over 50,000 calls are received by the Utah Poison Control Center. More than 60% of the exposures involve children less than six years of age.

**1-800-222-1222** In 2010, 94% of all poisonings occurred in the home. Fortunately 79% were managed on site with telephone follow-up. Therefore, it is critical to safeguard the home environment. The Utah Poison Control Center reminds everyone to make poisoning prevention a year-round responsibility.

The top three poison categories in children involve: (1). Cosmetics and personal care products, (2). Household cleaning products, (3). Pain killers such as acetaminophen and ibuprofen.

The top three poison categories in adults involve: (1). Pain killers including narcotics and over-the-counter analgesics, (2). Sedatives (drugs to reduce anxiety) and hypnotics (sleep aids), (3). Antidepressants.
